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### Day 1: Welcome to Phnom Penh

**Saturday, DEC. 07, 2013**

**Fly Bangkok to Phnom Penh on PG931@08:05 – 09:15, CAMBODIA**

In Phnom Penh, after clearing immigration and customs, to be welcome by our guide and transfer to your hotel. This city was once considered one of the most beautiful in Orient, and despite its recent turbulent history it still retains a colonial charm.

Settle in and enjoy the remainder of day at your leisure.

### Day 2: Phnom Penh

**Sunday, DEC. 08, 2013**

*Meals Provided: B*

After breakfast, you'll head out with your guide and spend the morning visit the **Royal Palace** built in 1866 by King Norodom. See the different structures of this pagoda-style compound and stroll in its beautiful garden. Visit the **Silver Pagoda** so

named because of its floor that is comprised of 5,000 silver tiles. A gold Buddha encrusted with 9,584 diamonds and a small 17th century emerald and baccarat crystal Buddha are also housed here.

Next, continue to visit the **National Museum**. Built in 1917 it is an exceptional example of traditional architecture and is exclusively devoted to preserving and displaying Khmer art and sculptures. Hundreds of pieces are housed here including both pre-and post-Angkorian pieces. End your afternoon tour with a visit to the city's namesake, **Wat Phnom**. Founded in 1373, the pagoda was built to house Buddhist relics washed ashore by the river.

You'll be returned to your hotel with the afternoon free to relax or explore independently.

### **Day 3: Phnom Penh** **Monday, DEC. 09, 2013**

*Meals Provided: B*

This morning you will visit the city's School of Fine Arts and then drive to the Killing Fields of **Choeung Ek** (16 km south of Phnom Penh). Between 1975 and 1978 about 17,000 men, women, children and infants (including nine westerners) detained and tortured at S-21 prison were transported to the extermination camp of Choeung Ek. They were often bludgeoned to death to avoid wasting precious bullets. Fragments of human bone and bits of cloth are scattered around the disinterred pits. Over 8,000 skulls, arranged by sex and age, are visible behind the clear glass panels of the Memorial Stupa, which was erected in 1988. Return to Phnom Penh. Next continue to visit the notorious **Tuol Sleng Museum**. In 1975 Tuol Svay Prey High School was taken over by Pol Pot's security forces and turned into a prison known as Security Prison 21 (S-21). It soon became the largest such center of detention and torture in the country. More than 17,000 people held at S-21 were taken to the extermination camp at Choeung Ek to be executed; detainees who died during torture were buried in mass graves in the prison ground. Room after room the museum displays photographs of men, women and children covering the walls from floor to ceiling; virtually all the people pictured were later killed.

Later this afternoon visit the Russian Market (**Psah Tuol Thom Pong**), a lively outdoor market where you will find antiques, silver and gold jewelry, gems, silk, kramas, stone and wood carvings, as well as T-Shirts, CDs and other souvenirs. Enjoy **one hour sunset cruise** on the Mekong and Tonle Sap Rivers. The boat will pass past floating villages, providing great views of the city's rapidly changing skyline.

### **Day 4: Phnom Penh / Battambang** **Tuesday, DEC. 10, 2013**

*Meals Provided: B*

Morning, pick up at your hotel in Phnom Penh and depart Phnom Penh for Battambang by overland transfer (290 km. 4-5 hours drive). Stop to see the

**silversmith village** and the pottery village in **Kompong Chhnang**. Board a private boat to see the floating village along the **Tonle Sap River** in Kompong Chhnang. Then continue drive to **Pursat** and visit the stone carving in Pursat. Arrive in Battambang, the second largest city in Cambodia. It is located on a rich and fertile plain, which provides much of the rice and other important crops for the country. Then proceed to Battambang and arrive in Battambang in the late afternoon, and transfer to Bambu Hotel. Settle in and enjoy the evening at your leisure.

**Day 5: Battambang**  
**Wednesday, DEC. 11, 2013**

*Meals Provided: B*

Breakfast at hotel. Stroll through the city with its well preserved example of colonial architecture and visit the local market. Then drive along the picturesque Sangker River to **Wat Slaket pagoda**, the residence of the provincial Buddhist patriarch. Continue to visit **Wat Ek Phnom** (11th century – Suryavarman I). Then visit **Phare Ponleu Selpak**, this centre supports around 30 orphans and trafficking victims and is schooling more than 1,200 pupils, over 400 of who study visual arts, music, circus, drama and dance for leisure or vocational training. Afternoon, visit **Phnom Banon**, with its five sandstone towers on top of a hill and enjoy a magnificent view of the surrounding plains. Enjoy Battambang truly unique form of local transportation and take a ride on the **Bamboo Train** through the picturesque countryside. Return to Battambang for a walk through the town to discover its beautiful colonial architecture and the local market.

**Day 6: Battambang / Phnom Penh**  
**Thursday, DEC. 12, 2013**

*Meals Provided: B*

After morning leisure you will depart Battambang on a beautiful drive through the Cambodian countryside to Phnom Penh, the capital of Cambodia. On arrival in Phnom Penh transfer to your hotel. The late afternoon is free to spend at your leisure.

**Day 7: Phnom Penh / Takeo / Kep**  
**Friday, DEC. 13, 2013**

*Meals Provided: B*

This morning your guide will meet you at your hotel and take you to the coastal village of Kep. En route, stop at **Tonle Bati** and visit **Ta Prohm** temple (12th-13th centuries) and **Yeay Peau** temple (12th century). Visit the **Prasat Neang Khmao**, the temple of the Black Virgin (10th century). Visit a silk weaving village before proceeding to Takeo. Take a boat from Takeo to **Phnom Da** (please note that the speedboat does not have a cover or any shade – hat and sun tan cream are essential). Visit **Phnom Da** temple, a pre-Angkorian laterite tower (6th century) and

**Asram Maharosei** (6th century), an Indian-style sandstone temple constructed in a style unlike any other temple in Cambodia. Return to Takeo by boat and continue to Kep, formerly known as Kep-sur-Mer. This beautiful coastal area was once the favorite holiday spot for Cambodia's French-influenced elite. On arrival in Kep check in to your bungalows on the forested hill above Kep and enjoy the remainder of the day and evening at leisure.

**Day 8: Kep**  
**Saturday, DEC. 14, 2013**

*Meals Provided: B/L*

This morning enjoy a half-day boat trip to **Rabbit Island** (Koh Tunsay) and discover the beautiful and pristine scenery. Reach Rabbit Island by fisherman boat, located 4.5 km from Kep. Enjoy beautiful nature, white sand beaches and excellent swimming conditions. Unwind yourself at the beach. For those who want to be more active, take a 30 minute hike up to the top of the hill where you discover the remnants of American artillery, dating from the Vietnam War. Later this afternoon we return to the hotel and enjoy a relaxing evening.

**Day 9: Kep / Kampot / Sihanoukville**  
**Sunday, DEC. 15, 2013**

*Meals Provided: B*

This morning drive to **Kampot**, situated on the south bank of the Teuk Chhou River, Kampot is one of the most charming places to visit in Cambodia. It was once a bustling trading port, populated mostly by Chinese merchants, the relatives of whom still live there today. In town, there are colonial shop houses whose architecture is characteristic of the 1900s. Visit the colorful and lively market where many bargains are to be found. Discover the French colonial and post colonial Kampot, Chinese way of life, architecture and institutions. Stopping at the temple caves at **Phnom Chnork** before continuing to the seaside resort of Sihanoukville, Cambodia's major beach resort.

There are 4 main beaches to explore round here and some fantastic trips to islands just off shore. There is also fantastic seafood to be had. In season, diving is also possible. On arrival in Sihanoukville check into your beachside accommodations and enjoy the remainder of the day and evening at leisure.

**Day 11: Sihanoukville / Tatai**

**Tuesday, DEC. 17, 2013**

Breakfast at the Resort. Depart from Sihanoukville to Tatai on a scenic 290km journey through the Cardamon Mountains (5 hours). Arrive at the Tatai Bridge and take a 30 minute boat ride to the 4Rivers Floating Lodge, your home for the next two nights, built on the river with gorgeous surroundings and peaceful seclusion, privacy and luxury far away from the beaten trail - the Four Rivers Floating Lodge must be one of the most unique and unusual properties we have come across. Situated on the curve of a river in the little explore Cardamom Mountains, close to the border with Thailand, it offers an unforgettable and magical escape. Spend time at leisure in the afternoon to fully enjoy the peace and quiet at the floating Resort. Go for a swim in the fresh river or take a kayak to discover the mangroves near the Resort.

This late afternoon enjoy the Paradise Regained - Sunset Cruise (*join-in with resort tour*), departure at 4.30pm, 2-3 hours or as long as you are enjoying yourselves. Leave your worries behind and cruise off into the Cardamoms' superb sunset aboard our boat. Snuggle up with that special someone as the sun paints the sky with colors that change from brilliant blues to deep yellows, oranges, pinks and reds. **Day 12: Tatai**

**Wednesday, DEC. 18, 2013**

*Meals Provided: B*

This morning, take a boat trip to Tatai Waterfall. Nature's Spa – Tatai Waterfall by boat (*join-in with resort tour*). One of the must-sees of the region, departure at 10am, 5-6 hours or as long as you are enjoying yourselves. Some degree of fitness is necessary for enjoying this trip to the full. Away from the tranquility of 4 Rivers Floating Lodge, the thunder of the majestic Tatai Falls reveals the river's true power as it drops 6 meters to the rocks below. Your day, depending on the tide, starts at around 10am for the 45-minute boat ride past Tatai village to the falls.

Turning on to a tributary you head into the heart of the Cardamom jungle to the far-off sounds of exotic birds and its secretive wildlife. Within minutes you are at

journey's end, gazing down into the turbulent waters of the falls. Soon it's time for lunch, maybe a few moments hydro-massage and a refreshing drink as you find some shade for a picnic and open your senses to the sights and sounds of the jungle. We will also arrange to transport some kayaks for your added fun and adventure.

After leaving the falls, we stop at the mouth of a small river where you can paddle your kayak to a traditional Cambodian farm; you will see rice fields and some fruit trees depending of the season. Later this afternoon we return to the lodge and enjoy a relaxing evening.

**Day 13: Tatai / Phnom Penh / Bangkok**  
**Thursday, DEC. 19, 2013**
